

E-POSTER SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

1. Description

Graphic representation of a completed work, research project or experience, including title, authors, affiliated institutions, text, tables and explanatory figures.

2. Fundamental requirements:

- The submitted work must be theoretically grounded in EMDR therapy.
- The work must be complete at the time of submission.
- Work in progress will not be accepted.
- The following will not be accepted: reports, translations, promotion of commercial entities/companies/brands.
- Ongoing research work will not be accepted: it must be finished at the time of submission.

3. By methodology:

- Quantitative research.
- Qualitative research: includes clinical experiences, non-systematized literature reviews, non-systematized case reports, and graphic representations of essays or assessments.

4. Originality

- Works must be original.
- They may not have been previously presented at scientific events.
- They may not be published (either online or in print).

5. Deadlines

- Abstract submission until July 31, 2026, 24:00 hs (Argentina time)
- Submission of the graphic poster (if the abstract was approved) until September 15th, 2026, 24:00 hs (Argentina time)
- Important: If the graphic poster is not received before the deadline, the proposal will be withdrawn.

6. Mandatory documentation

- Conflict of interest statement (all participants).
- Informed consent (if the proposal involves patients).
- Ethics Committee approval (if applicable).

7. Registration requirements:

8. All poster authors must register once the poster has been approved.

9. All presenters will receive a certificate of presentation.

10. Graphic poster format

11. Technical specifications:

- Single slide only
- Formats: PPTX, PPT or PDF exclusively
- Orientation: Vertical
- On-screen presentation: 4:3
- Size: 28.58 cm (width) x 50.79 cm (height)
- Template available: online submission system (includes Congress logos).

The E-Poster Abstract must be prepared in an MS-Word document (.docx format) and sent, together with all supporting documentation (Informed Consent forms, Ethics Committee approval), to: congreso2026@emdribargentina.org.ar.

1. Abstract requirements

- i. Title (maximum 150 characters). Brief, original and engaging. No quotation marks. No abbreviations (except commonly used ones). Standard English grammar rules.

2. Abstract (250-450 words)

- i. Must include:
 - 1. 4 to 5 keywords
 - 2. Hypothesis (if research) or theoretical framework (if clinical practice)
 - 3. Importance of the topic (in detail)
 - 4. Materials and methods: type of design, reasons for the choice, data processing
 - 5. Results (in detail)
 - 6. Conclusions (broad and clear)

3. Objectives (3 to 5)

- i. Start with a verb in the infinitive form
- ii. Complete: "By the end of the activity, participants will be able to..."
- iii. Use Bloom's taxonomy

4. Bibliography

- i. 5 to 10 peer-reviewed references (last 5 years) - standardized format (APA recommended)
- ii. Up to 5 classic references - standardized format

5. Personal data (see Appendix A for full details)

6. Presentation

- i. Format: e-Poster (digital monitors)

7. Interaction with attendees:

- i. Assigned time slot (published in the Scientific Program).
- ii. Prepare a 10-15 minute defense.
- iii. Suggestion: bring printed material or a QR code to share with attendees.

8. Awards

- i. The Best Poster 2026 Award and two Honorable Mentions will be given.
- ii. The presentation before the Jury will consist of: a 7-minute defense + 3 minutes of questions from the Jury.

9. Announcement:

- i. Winners will be announced at the Congress Opening Ceremony.

10. Conflict of interest statement

i. Mandatory for every participant. Must indicate whether they have:

1. Commercial or financial commitments, institutional affiliations, grants or subsidies, payments for consulting fees, salaries or other compensation, that could represent an apparent conflict in relation to the submitted proposal.
2. If there is no conflict, state: *"No conflict of interest."

11. Informed consent and Ethics Committee

- i. When it is required
 1. Research conducted with human participants.
 2. Clinical case presentations.

12. What to submit

- i. Informed consent signed by the patient(s), or
- ii. Sworn statement (template available), or
- iii. Ethics Committee approval (if applicable).

13. Protection of patient identity

- i. Prohibited: providing any clue that could allow a patient to be identified.

14. Use of artificial intelligence

By submitting a proposal, you agree to the "Declaración de Heredia: Principios sobre el uso de inteligencia artificial en la edición científica" (Heredia Declaration: Principles on the Use of Artificial Intelligence in Scientific Publishing).

This means: if you used AI to write, analyze data or generate content, you must explicitly declare it. You must specify which tools you used and for what purpose.

- i. Once a proposal is approved, ALL members must:
 - 1. Register for the Congress within 15 calendar days of notification,
 - 2. Complete their personal form,
 - 3. Pay the corresponding fee

16. Scientific Committee corrections

- i. The Scientific Committee reserves the right to:
 - 1. Make minor grammatical corrections without prior notice (e.g., adding question marks).
 - 2. Suggest modifications to the title, content, objectives, methodology or bibliography.
 - 3. Modify the assigned topic if it considers another one more appropriate.
